# **QUARTERLY EVOLUTION OF THE SELECTED MACROECONOMIC INDICATORS AT THE END OF JUNE 2014**




## I. EXPORT AGRICULTURE

### I.1. 2014/2015 COFFEE SEASON

The coffee productionas of the 2014/2015 season is expected to increase, following the cyclicity of coffee yield. In fact, according to the ARFIC estimate, the production of the campaign should raise by 13,575 T, from 14,134 T the previous campaign up to 27,709 T (96.0 pc).The quantity of coffee in parchment produced by June 2014 reached 6,254 T while it hadn't begun at the same period of last year.

Estimates indicate an improvement of the quality for this season. In factthe share of fully washed coffee in parchment should cover 67. 5 against 53.7 p.c. the previous year.

As forgreen coffee, the overall quantity recordedduring the campaign is expected to reach 21,800 T from 10,753 T in the previous year, reflecting an increase of 10,047 T. At the end of June, the quantity of green coffee already produced reached 1,382 T while it was not yet produced at the same period of last year.

Concerning sales, the average price of green cof-fee in June attained 199.76 cts/lb against 141.07 cts/lbrecordedat the beginning of previous cam-paign, following the prices' developments on the international market. Therefore, the quantity of 2014/2015 campaign sold in June 2014 amount-ed to1,094 T valued at BIF 7,386 million.

### I.2. Tea

The tea leaves production of the first half of year 2014 rose by 8.6 per cent compared to the corresponding period of 2013, reaching 27,104 from 29, 422 T, in relation to good rainfall and the application of fertilizers. This development concerned all tea factories, particularly those of Ijenda (12.8 p.c.) and Teza (15.4 p.c.).

Similarly, the quantity of dry tea obtained after machining increased by 9.1 p.c. at the end of June, attaining 6,257 against 5,734 T. Thus, the average milling yield slightly augmented from 21.2 to 21.3 pc.

Concerning sales, the volume of dry tea sold at the end of June increased by 11.8 p.c., reaching 5,460 against 4,883 T in the same period of last year. However, sale income decreased by 8.8 p.c., falling from BIF 19,605 to 18,018 million due to the drop in prices (4,133 against 3,345 BIF/kg) at the international market.


## II. INDUSTRIAL PRODUCTION

### II.1. Quarterly development

Compared to the same period of the previous year, the industrial sector recorded a slight increase in production during the second quarter of 2014.

In fact, the weighted average index of industrial production rose by 1.7 pc, following the improvement in production of chemical (38.1 p.c.) and building materials industries(12.2 p.c.) whichoutweighedthe decline inproduction of food industry (-1.9 p.c.).

The increase in production of the chemical industries sector is mainly associated with the augmentation in soap production (31.2 p.c.) and plastic crates (173.1p.c.).

The performance in building materials industry resulted from the increase of the production of PVC pipes (13.4 p.c.).


The decline in activity of food industries is essentially related to the delay in starting sugar campaign compared tothe previous year.

### II.2. Semi-annual development

During the first half of year 2014, the industrial activity progressed slightly. In fact, the weighted average index of industrial production rose to 110.7 from 108.7 in the same period of last year.

This augmentation is mainly due to the progression in the production of chemical industry (+39.3 p.c.) and building materials industry (+15.2 p.c.) while food industry production slowed down (-2.1 p.c.).

The decline in food industryactivity is essentially associated with the decrease in the production of sugar (-39.1 p.c.) and cigarettes (-7.5 p.c.).

By contrast the increase in production of the chemical industries sector is mainly related to the augmentation in production of soaps (40.1 p.c.) and plastic crates (132. 8 p.c.).

Similarly the production in the industry of building materials expanded, following good performance in the manufacture of PVC pipes (59.8 p.c.) thanks to the increase in demand.



### III. CONSUMER PRICE INDEX

#### III.1. Quarterly evolution

Inflation as of second quarter 2014 stood at 3.8 pc, lower than 6.5 pcrecordedin the same period of 2013. This deceleration in inflation concerned both “food products (1.7 vs 7.4 p.c.) and non-food products (6.8 vs 7.1 p.c.).

The decline in “non-food” inflation resulted fromthe divisions “alcoholic beverages”, (-1.1vs 14.4 p.c.), “recreation and culture” (2.9 vs 3.6 p.c.), “hotel, coffee and restaurant” (5.8 vs9.0 p.c.), and other goods (10.5 vs 25.1 p.c.),which outscoredthe acceleration in prices of the divisions “clothing and shoes” (6.7 vs1.3 p.c.), “communication ” (0.2 vs 0.0 p.c.), “housing, water and electricity” (5.5 vs5.1 p.c.), “furniture, household equipment and routine household maintenance ” (22.5 vs 7.4 p.c.), “health” (6.0 vs 2.9 p.c.) and “transportation” (9.6 vs 6.0 p.c.).

#### III.2. Semiannualevolution

During the first half of 2014, the inflation rate declined compared with the same period of 2013 (4.5 against 7.2 p.c.).

The slow increase in prices resultedfromboth theprices of “food products” and “nonfood products”.

Compared with the previous semester, the inflation rate decreased from 8.7 pc to 4.5 pc.This slowdown concerned “food” products (3.3 vs 11.0 p.c.), while inflation of “non-food” products recorded a slight increase (6.8 vs 6.4 p.c.).


## IV. MONEY SURVEY

### IV.1. Broad money and its counterparts

#### IV.1.1. Quarterly development

At the end of the second quarter of 2014, broad money M3 (BIF 993,028.0 million against BIF 936,027.0 million) increased by 6.1 percent which is higher than the 5 percent increase registered in the first quarter of 2014.

The increase in broad money (M3) resulted from the rise in M2 (BIF 61,094.0 million), while foreign currencies deposits of residents decreased (-BIF 4,093.0 million).

The rise in M2 concerned both monetary aggregate M1 (BIF 60,626.8 million) and time deposits (BIF 467.2 million) when the progress in M1 concerned currency outside banks (BIF 22,729.6 million) and demand deposits (BIF 37,897.2 million).

The rise in demand deposits denominated in local currency mainly concerned the increase in household deposits (BIF 5,228.9 million), other nonfinancial corporation deposits (BIF 14,634.0 million), public nonfinancial corporation deposits (BIF 6,051.6 million) and the deposits classified under « other accounts » (BIF 11,203.0 million).

The progression of time and saving deposits denominated in local currency resulted from the rise in household deposits (BIF 2,787.2 million) and deposits classified under « other accounts » (BIF 2,861.9 million). By contrast, other nonfinancial corporation deposits and public nonfinancial corporation deposits declined respectively by BIF 1,696.9 BIF million and BIF 3,294.4 million.

The contraction in foreign deposits of residents mainly resulted from the decrease in other nonfinancial corporation deposits (-BIF 6,820.1 million) and public nonfinancial corporation deposits (- BIF 959.5 million) that outperformed the rise in household deposits (BIF 3,735.5 million).

The surpassing of the increase in net claims on government (BIF 70,565.3 million) and in the claims on the economy (BIF 25,655.6 million) over the decrease in net foreign assets (- BIF 26,175.3 million) and net other items (-BIF 13,044.6 million) resulted in the increase in the broad money.

Thus, the rise in M3 is attributed to a 8.9 points increase in net domestic assets, slightly offset by a 2.8 points decrease in net foreign assets.

The expansion in net claims on government resulted from the rise in Central Bank overdrafts (BIF 30,796.6 million), Treasury bills and bonds held by commercial banks (BIF 25,437.2 million) and the decrease in government deposits (-BIF 15,582.2 million). The use of the resources from the Central Bank and from commercial banks is linked to the lack of domestic revenue and the delay of external budget support.

The progress in claims on the economy mainly resulted from the increase in the cash loans (BIF 6,579.7 million), exports loans (BIF 5,468.1 million) and in long-term financing (BIF 12,077.5 million).

Declining from BIF 210,948.1 million to BIF 184,772.8 million from March to June 2014, net foreign assets decreased by 12.4 p.c. This decline resulted from the decrease in net foreign assets of commercial banks (-BIF 20,228.2 million) and those of the Central Bank (-BIF 5,947.1 million). Similarly, converted in US Dollars, foreign exchange reserves decrease by 12.5 p.c., from USD 136.6 million in March 2014 USD 119.5 million in June 2014.

#### IV.1.2. Biannual change

Compared to December 2013, the broad money increased by BIF 53,500.1 million, either 5.7 p.c., going from BIF 939,527.9 to 993,028.0 million. This progress resulted from the increase of the monetary aggregate M2 (BIF 44,775.9 million) and the foreign assets of residents (BIF 8,724.2 million).

The rise in the broad money (M2) concerned the increasing in narrow money (BIF 24,518.3 million) and in time and saving deposits (BIF 20,257.6 million). The progress in M1 resulted from the increase in the currency outside banks (BIF 8,394.7 million) and in demand deposits (BIF 16,123.6 million).

The increasing in demand deposits concerned the other nonfinancial corporation deposits (BIF 15,672.4 million), public nonfinancial corporation deposits (BIF 596.5 million) and deposits classified in "other accounts" (BIF 1,346.0 million). On the other hand, household deposits, deposit of other financial intermediaries and local administration deposits declined by BIF 583.8 million, BIF 790.6 million and BIF 116.9 million respectively, in the period.

The progress in time deposits denominated in local currency is mainly attributed to the increase of household deposits (BIF 7,542.7 million), other nonfinancial corporation deposits (BIF 5,944.3 million) and to deposits classified in "other accounts" (BIF 14,296.6 million). On the other hand, deposits of public nonfinancial corporations decreased by BIF 7,336.4 million.

The rise in foreign deposits of residents is mainly related to the increase in household deposits (BIF 5,874.2 million), other nonfinancial corporation deposits (BIF 4,836.5 million) that exceeded the decline in public nonfinancial corporation deposits (-BIF 626.5 million) and in deposits classified in "other accounts" (-BIF 1,317.4 million).

The increase in net claims on government (BIF 84,269.2 million) and of claims on the economy (BIF 21,472.2 million) that exceeded the decline in net foreign assets (-BIF 44,983.3 million) and net other items (-BIF 7,258.0 million) resulted in the increasing in broad money.

The rise in claims on the economy mainly resulted from the increase in short-term (BIF 24,033.4 million) and the long-term financings (BIF 10,510.2 million). On the other hand, the middle-term financing decreased by BIF 8,031.5 million

The progress in net debt of government mainly resulted primarily from the increase in Central Bank overdrafts (BIF 39,309.6 million), in Treasury securities held by commercial banks (BIF 25,189.2 million) and from the decline in government deposits (-BIF 22,321.2 million).

Net foreign assets declined by 19.6 p.c. from BIF 229,756.1 at December 2013 to BIF 184,772.8 million at June 2014. This decrease concerned net foreign assets of commercial banks (-BIF 15,921.0 million) and those of the Central Bank (-BIF 29,062.3 million). Similarly, in US Dollars, foreign exchange reserves decreased by 19.8 p.c., from USD 149.0 million at end of December 2013 to USD 119.5 million at the end of June 2014.

## IV.2. Banking liquidity

### IV.2.1. Quarterly evolution

At the end of the second quarter of 2014, the liquidity of banking sector rose by BIF 3,046.3 million against BIF 11,607.6 million recorded at the end of the previous quarter, from BIF 96,992.4 million to BIF 100,038.7 million.


This development resulted from the expansive impact exerted by the rise in net claims on government (BIF 39,250.3 million) that prevailed on the restrictive effect resulting from the decline in net foreign assets (-BIF 5,947.1 million), net other items (-BIF 7,775.9 million) and from the increase in currency in circulation (BIF 22,481.0 million).

Following the increase in autonomous factors, the commercial banks repaid the Central Bank refinancing (-BIF 325.1 million) and increased their reserves by BIF 29,753.6 million.

## IV.2.2. Biannual change

Compared to end of December 2013, the banking sector liquidity recorded at the end of June 2014 increased by BIF 14,653.9 million, from BIF 85,384.8 million to BIF 100,038.7 million. This rise resulted from the increase in net claims on government (BIF 53,171.4 million) and net other assets (BIF 2,642.9 million) that widely exceeded the restrictive effect exercised by the decline in net foreign assets (-BIF 29,062.3 million) and by the increase in currency in circulation (BIF 12,098.1 million).

## V. PUBLIC FINANCE

### V.1. Revenue

Total revenue excluding grants as of the first half of 2014 reached BIF 301,953.3 million from BIF 272,587.2 million recorded at the same period in 2013 (10.8 p.c.). This increase resulted from performance in collection of tax revenue (+ BIF 3,821.4 million), non-tax revenue (+ BIF 22,668.2 million) and exceptional receipts (+BIF 2,876.5 million).

### V.2. Expenses

Total expenses incurred by the Government in the first half of 2014 increased by 27.8 p.c., reaching BIF 527,974.0 million from BIF 413,090.0 million recorded during the first half of 2013. Current expenses increased by BIF 23,056.8 million when capital expenses increased by BIF 91,932.4 million.

The sharp increase in expenses (+27.8 p.c.) relative to revenue (+10.8 p.c.) resulted to a deficit excluding grants larger than that of the same period in 2013 (BIF 226,020.9 million vs BIF 140,397.9 million).

Likewise, the deficit including grants was larger in the first half 2014 than in the corresponding period of 2013 (BIF 125,027.5 million against BIF 21,755.6 million) and was financed both by external and internal sources (BIF 42,488.1 million and BIF 93,188.5 million respectively).

### V.3. Domestic debt

Compared to the end of June 2013 the stock domestic debt as of June 2014 expanded by 20.0 p.c., from BIF 560,126.4 million to BIF 672,246.8 million, following the rise in Government debt to banking sector (+BIF 96,527.7 million) and non-banking sector (+ BIF 15,592.7 million).


Compared with the first quarter, the stock of domestic debt expanded by 63,974.1 MBIF, reaching BIF 672,246.8 million from BIF 608,272.7 million, due to the increase in Government liabilities to the banking sector (+ BIF 54,983.2 million) and non-banking sector (+ BIF 8,990.9 million).

### V.4. External Debt

The stock of public external debt recorded an increase of BIF 60,021.1 million at the end of the second quarter 2014, standing at BIF 667,819.4 million against BIF 607,798.3 million at the same period in 2013.

Compared to the first quarter 2014, the stock of external debt at the end of second quarter 2014 increased by BIF 5,384.5 million, from BIF 662,434.9 million to BIF 667,819.4 million.

The progression in external debt at the end of the second quarter 2014 relative to the corresponding period in 2013 was a result of BIF 48,629.5 million of new drawings on external loans and revaluation surplus of BIF 19,816.9 million that largely outweighed BIF 8,425.3 million of repayments of the principal.

Converted in US Dollars, the stock of external debt as of June 2014 increased by USD 36.7 million, reaching USD 431.8 million against USD 395.1 million at the same period in 2013.

## VI. BALANCE OF SETTLEMENTS

### VI.1. Quarterly development


The balance of settlements of the second quarter 2014 registered a deep deficit compared to the corresponding period of the previous year (-BIF 16,778.5 million vs BIF -8,979.9 Million) due to the deterioration in current account balance (-BIF 82,226.6 million vs - BIF 42,518.6 million) while capital and financial account improved (BIF 65,448.1 million vs BIF 33,538.7 million).


The deficit of current account mainly resulted from a deterioration in deficit of balance of goods and services (-BIF 176,243.0 million vs -BIF 153,691.1 million) and the decline in surplus of balance of primary and secondary income (BIF 94,016.4 million vs BIF 111,172.5 million).

The increase in surplus of capital account is due to the current transfer in favor of public sector (BIF 39,391.6 million vs BIF 31,148.8 million) and direct investments (BIF 26,056.5 million vs BIF 2,389.9 million).

### VI.2. Semi-annual development

Compared to the corresponding period of 2013, the balance of settlements of first semester 2014 recorded a further deficit (-BIF 87,888.0 million against - BIF 12,329.7 million) resulted from the deterioration in current account balance (-BIF 183,425.5 million vs - BIF 72,537.6 million), while surplus in capital transactions improved (BIF 95,537.5 million vs BIF 60,207.8 million).

## I. PRODUCTION AND SALE OF SOME PRODUCTS

### TABLES I.1. & I.2. Production of Arabica coffee by campaign and statement of sales

The two tables provide information on the cumulative production of parchment and machined coffee by campaign and the statement of sale contracts. They are established from data on coffee sector sent monthly by the coffee company (ARFIC).

### TABLE I.3. & I.4. Production of tea leaves and dried tea, monthly sales in quantity, value and prices

These tables show the harvest of tea leaves, the production of dry tea and the dry tea sales. They are derived from the monthly activity reports assigned by the Burundi Tea Authority.

### TABLE I.5. Production of the main industries

This table is elaborated from data collected from the main industrial enterprises. The productions are regrouped within the food, chemical and materials of construction industries.

### TABLE I.6. Weighted index of the industrial production

The table indicates the relative proportion of the weighted index of food, chemical, textile and other industries in the general index of the industrial production.

This index is computed on basis of the weighting coefficients representing the contribution of each product in the total added value of the branch. These coefficients are extracted from results of the survey carried out in 1989 on commercial and industrial enterprises.

### TABLES I.7 & I.8. Production and consumption of electric energy

The table I.7 shows the national production of electricity by hydroelectric power station. The table I.8 indicates the electric energy consumption by main urban centers. These data are provided by REGIDESO.

## II. MONEY AND CREDIT

### II.1. COVERAGE

#### II.1.1. Central Bank

The Central Bank is a monetary authority whose fundamental functions are: define and implement monetary and exchange rate policies, to regulate and supervise financial sector, issue currency, manage international reserves as well as to provide loans to other deposit corporations under the charge of the Central Bank.

#### II.1.2. Commercial Banks

Commercial Banks are Institutions that collect demand deposits that can be transferred by check or used as any other direct or long term means of payment, they are also involved in credit operations.

Institutions registered as commercial banks until now are: Banque de Crédit de Bujumbura (BCB), Banque Commerciale du Burundi (BANCOBU), Inter Bank Burundi (IBB), Banque de Gestion et de Financement (BGF), Finalease Bank (FINBANK), Banque Burundaise pour le Commerce et l'investissement (BBCI), Diamond Trust Bank Burundi (DTB), Kenya Commercial Bank Burundi (KCB Bank Burundi), Cooperative for Rural Development Bank (CRDB Bank Burundi) and ECOBANK Burundi.

Data on DTB, KCB Bank Burundi LMT and CRDB Bank Burundi are integrated in commercial banks statistics since June 2009, July 2012 and December 2012 respectively.

#### II.1.3. Other Financial Intermediaries

As by their usual profession, the other financial intermediaries give loans. They are allowed to borrow without having neither counters nor accounts for the clientele. The institutions registered in this category are Banque Nationale pour le Développement Economique (BNDE) and Fonds de Promotion de l'Habitat Urbain (FPHU).

## **II.1. CONTENTS OF TABLES**

### **TABLE II.1.FOREIGN EXCHANGE RESERVES**

Foreign exchange reserves are given by the sum of foreign assets of the BRB and Commercial Banks minus their external liabilities. The external reserves of the Central Bank regard only the foreign exchange reserves that the Bank can freely have at its disposal including foreign currencies, monetary Gold, SDR and the IMF reserve position in IMF.

### **TABLES II.2.1 & II.2.2. Balance sheet of BRB**

The table shows the Central Bank's balance sheet as stated at the end of each month. In the liabilities side, this statement shows all the liabilities of the Central Bank as monetary authority while the assets side indicates the counterparts of those liabilities. The item "foreign assets" includes among others, demand and time deposits, currencies, IMF reserve position which is the difference between Burundi's share in the IMF (the account IMF n°1) and IMF securities account.

### **TABLES II.3.1 & II.3.2 Balance sheet of commercial banks**

The tables show the consolidation of balance sheets of all commercial banks.

### **TABLES II.4.1 & II. 4.2. Monetary survey**

The Tables indicate the consolidation of assets and liabilities of BRB, commercial banks and Postal Checking Accounts. The asset represents counterparts of broad money (M2) which are: net foreign assets and domestic credit. In turn, liability shows broad money and net other items.

### **TABLES II.5. Base money, broad money and evolution of the money multiplier**

The table shows the evolution of base money and its counterparts, broad money (M2) and money multiplier, which is the ratio between broad money and monetary base.

### **TABLES II.6.1 & II.6.2. Consolidated balance sheet of other financial intermediaries**

The tables show the consolidation of assets and liabilities of BNDE and FPHU.

### **TABLES II.7.1 & II.7.2. Consolidated balance sheet of financial system**

The tables denote the consolidation of monetary survey and consolidated statement of other financial intermediaries.

### **TABLE II.8. Liquidity of the banking sector**

The table indicates autonomous factors of the banking liquidity which appear on the balance sheet of the BRB. Autonomous factors are those beyond direct control of Central Bank.

### **TABLE II.9. Banking deposits by holder**

The table informs on deposits broken down by term and holder. These deposits are used to calculate broad money.

### **TABLE II.10. Breakdown of time deposits and other resources of commercial banks**

The table shows the evolution of all time deposits and other resources of commercial banks by term.

### **TABLE II.11. Evolution of financial system risks**

The table highlights the outstanding credits to economy (including unpaid loans) and signature commitments of commercial banks and financial establishments. Loans are divided in category and term.

### **TABLE II.12. Ventilation of loans by sector of activity**

The table indicates the evolution of credits according activity sectors.

### **TABLE II.13. Ventilation of loans and risks by term**

The table highlights the stock of credits by term and specifies for each performing and unperforming loans.

### **TABLES II.14 & II.15. Average deposit and lending interest rates applied by commercial banks**

The tables inform on weighted average interests rates paid and received by commercial banks on credits and interest bearing deposits.

#### **TABLE II.16. Clearing house activities**

The table shows, for each month, the number of transactions and the total amount carried out by the clearing house. Data are obtained by summing daily data.

#### **TABLE II.17. Weighted Average interest rates of public securities at the end of period**

It indicates, by term, the average interest rate of treasury securities registered at the end of each period.

#### **TABLE II. 18. Refinancing rate at the end of period**

The table indicates the refinancing rates applied by Central Bank at the end of period.

### **III. PUBLIC FINANCE AND DEBT**

#### **TABLE III. 1. Revenue and Grants**

The table indicates all the budget revenues (tax and nontax) as well as grants provided to the Government by external partners (current and capital grants).

#### **TABLE III. 2. Expenditures**

The table shows the Government's expenditures in two main components:

- Current expenditures (called also budget expenditures)
- Capital expenditures (called also investment expenditures).

#### **TABLE III.3. Overall financial operations**

The table shows the synthesis of Government Resources and Expenditures. It indicates the overall balance (deficit and its financing or surplus and its allocation).

#### **TABLE III.4. Domestic debt**

The table shows the outstanding domestic debt by creditor and type of loans.

#### **TABLE III.5. External debt operations**

The table shows the external financing operations (drawings, interest payment and principal repayment as well as revaluation).

#### **TABLE III.6. External debt by Creditor**

The table shows the main bilateral and multilateral creditors.

#### **TABLE III.7. : Evolution of external debt by economic sectors**

The table shows the allocation of external financing in various economic sectors.

#### **TABLE III.8. : Evolution of external debt by economic sectors in percentage**

The table shows the share of each sector in the allocation of external financing.

#### **TABLE III.9. : Schedule of external debt servicing**

The table indicates the amount to be paid as external debt service (interest and repayments).

### **IV. FOREIGN TRADE**

The compilation of foreign trade statistics refers to the elaboration of tables of imports (in volume and value CIF) and exports (in volume and value FOB Bujumbura) of goods and services.

Tables of imports and exports are set according:

1. The nomenclature of the International Convention on the Harmonized Commodity Description and Coding System.
2. Destination sectors of imports (consumption, equipment and production) and the nature of export products (Primary, manufacturing and others).
3. Countries of origin for imports and countries of destination for the exports.
- Statistics on foreign trade are elaborated from customs data, coffee auction and sale contracts for tea side.
4. International transactions include all transactions between residents and non-residents according to the Manual of the balance of payments (BPM6).

## V. MISCELLANEOUS STATISTICS

### TABLE V.1. Traffic in the port of Bujumbura

The table shows the traffic in the port of Bujumbura by gross volume of entries and exits of goods.

### TABLE V.2: Entries and exits of goods in the port of Bujumbura

In relation to the previous table, this table shows the evolution on five years, of entries and exits of goods (in volume) in the port of Bujumbura. Entries are grouped in food, chemical and textile industries, fuel and lubricants, equipment materials, vehicles and other products.

### TABLE V.3: Traffic in the international airport of Bujumbura

The table gives the traffic (arrivals and departures not including the transit) in the international Airport of Bujumbura. It shows the number of passengers, the tonnage of the baggage and freight as well as the volume of the postal mail.

### TABLES V.4, V.5. & V.6.: Entries, consumption and stock of the main oil products

These tables inform respectively on the volume of entries, the consumption and the available stock of fuel, petrol, gas oil and J.P.1 in the Company of storage of Oil Products "SEP".

### Table V.7. Price statistics

Statistics on prices are compiled on the basis of surveys of prices carried out by ISTEETBU on different markets of Bujumbura Capital. The food basket consists of items divided into eight groups as follows:

1. Food products and soft drinks;
2. Alcoholic drinks and tobacco;
3. Clothing and footwear;
4. Housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels;
5. Furnishings, household equipment and routine household maintenance
6. Health;
7. Transport;
8. Communication;
9. Leisure
10. Education;
11. Hotel, cafes and restoration
12. Other goods and services.

This classification was adopted in December 2013 to comply with international classification (COICOP).

### TABLES V.8, V.9 and V.10: Statistics of exchange rate

Statistics on exchange rates cover the main currencies quoted with uncertainty by the Central Bank. The Research and Statistics department uses exchange rates and price index of the various partners of Burundi in the calculation of nominal and real effective exchange rates of Burundi Franc.
